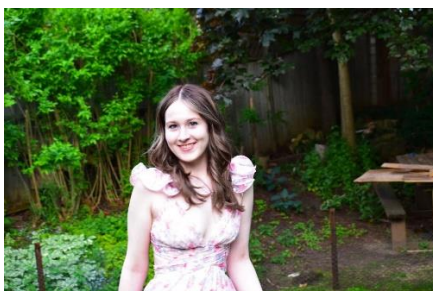


Caitlin Mount
